

The "Meals on Wheels" program menu from the CAB Le Virage is available in English. Delivery of meals takes place Monday through Friday between the hours of 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and are usually delivered by a volunteer. The meals have been prepared by the Fin Renard Restaurant. If modifications are required to the menu, they will advise in advance.

In order to be eligible for this program, seniors must meet $\underline{\mathbf{one}}$ of the following criteria:

- a) be 65 years of age or more;
- b) have declining or limited autonomy; or,
- c) temporarily convalescing from a medical condition.

The NSCA is currently recruiting for a **Programs Coordinator** who will assume the following responsibilities, under the direction of the NSCA Executive Director, commencing May 2020. This is a position based on a working schedule of 28 hours per week. **The position is based in Sept-Îles** and the person may be required to travel occasionally for professional development.

A Programs Coordinator is responsible for coordinating, developing and delivering outreach and community programs. He/she will help design, develop and organize community outreach activities.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES:

Under the guidance and supervision of the Executive Director:

- Responsible for planning, coordinating and assisting in health promotion and wellness programs for the community initiatives (youth & seniors);
- ♦ Develops and maintains relationships within the community;
- ◆ Communications with English-speaking community in promotion of programs and services, and increase knowledge of needs;
- ♦ Assists in the distribution of promotional materials;
- ♦ Assist in the coordination and delivery of Community Health Education Program (CHEP) sessions, as required;
- ◆ Other duties, as required and/or as assigned.

- ◆ University degree or post-secondary qualifications and/or relevant work experience;
- ◆ Experience with program development and working with diverse community groups;
- ◆ Excellent writing and speaking skills in English;

Budget strengthens the vitality of Québec's English-speaking communities

Baie-Comeau, March 16, 2020 – North Shore Community Association is very pleased with the allocation of \$18.8 million in additional funds for the English-speaking community tabled in the budget by the Quebec government.

New funds for wellness centres and employment, along with increased funding for organizational capacity building, all these items respond to important needs as voiced by community representatives during consultations held by the Secrétariat aux relations avec les Québécois d'expression anglaise (SRQEA) in the fall of 2019.

Wellness centres are unique meeting places for English-speaking communities and offer numerous activities for seniors. These centres help combat isolation and encourage active living while contributing to the vitality of their communities. English-speaking Quebecers also face special challenges in entering the job market and the allocation towards an employment strategy will help to improve employment integration and raise the employment rate of Québec's English-speaking population.

North Shore Community Association is also pleased with the additional funding for the Secretariat and its programs which have, since 2018, provided essential and targeted support to a wide range of community organizations and educational institutions through projects that contribute to the vitality of English-speaking communities.

North Shore Community Association is looking forward to partnering with the Secretariat and other community actors in continuing to strengthen the vitality of our English-speaking community in the North Shore region. The allocation over a five-year period is welcome news to be able to build and implement long-term programming where it counts most – in our local communities.

Youth Employability Programming for the NSCA



Through funding from the Secrétariat à la jeunesse, the North Shore Community Association (NSCA) has been working on an initiative related to employability for English-speaking youth, between the ages of 15-35 years of age, of the North Shore Region.

The project objective is to implement an employability plan that will assist English-speaking youth in preparing and seeking for employment. The initiative also aims to link youth to the various education and career paths available while the other is support and promote the services offered by the Carrefour Jeunesse-Emploi centres.

Recently a survey was conducted amongst our North Shore youth to gain a better understanding of their needs and to evaluate the awareness of existing services. A total of 65 youth responded to the survey, with participant responses from the MRC regions of Haute-Cote Nord, Sept-Rivières and Manicouagan. Through the responses we will be able to inform and assist service providers, academic institutions, and employers adapt in what they do to better meet the employment needs of the youth sector.

In the coming weeks, NSCA will be launching their new multi-pronged program, RIESS (Regional Individual Employment Services & Support), which will work towards address the main challenges facing the English-speaking communities of Québec's North Shore.

School Readiness Kits



Starting school is an emotional time, for both first-time pupils and for their families. Preschool and educational childcare centres will include activities to prepare children for school; most parents, naturally, offer some encouragement and comfort in anticipation of this milestone.

The North Shore, like most regions of Québec, has a relatively small English-speaking population, and good-quality, evidence-based resources in English can be hard to find. Through our Bright Beginnings program, the North Shore Community Association has researched and compiled information and activities to make sure the transition to school is as smooth as possible.

Our School Readiness Kit includes activities that suggest ways to stimulate and equip preschool-aged children. Contents of kit will help stimulate your child to develop skills in numeracy, language and literacy, concentration, motor skills, autonomy, and social and emotional integration.

The kits also contains resourceful information for parents; the sources can be found in the bibliography section of an activity booklet.
