"1000 WORDS" HERITAGE CAPSULE LAUNCH Quebec's regions face particular labour market challenges and this is especially true for English speakers living in these regions. In Quebec it is estimated to be costing its economy \$11 billion a year whereas in Canada, skills vacancies represent \$25 billion in unrealized economic value. This conference spoke to developing tailored programs for each region's needs. Panelists shared insights obtained from PERT's recent report of employment for English speakers in Quebec, and discussed the challenges, and opportunities that arise when developing effective community partnerships and how to develop these community partnerships for effective service delivery.

Our Executive Director, Jody Lessard, was one of the panelists for the session, "Beyond Numbers: Employment for English Speakers in Quebec". Many great discussions and contributions from participants from the English-speaking communities, conference speakers, panelists, and participants working together to address and find solutions for the employment challenges faced by Québec's English-speaking community. Hosted by the Consortium of English-Language CEGEPs, Colleges and Universities of Quebec, **The Provincial Employment Roundtable - PERT**, and the Regional Development Network (RDN), the UP 2023 event was funded by the Secrétariat aux relations avec les Québécois d'expression anglaise.

By joining forces and raising awareness we can build strong pathways to employment and increase the employability of Quebec's English-speaking population.

Drive through Spectacular Natural Splendour

Following the Expedition 51 trail is like a Choose-Your-Own-adventure trip; you can stay on it for a few days, the whole summer, or throughout the winter. The trail passes through boreal forest to taiga; it winds in and out of charming towns and villages where you can discover the lifestyle and culture of the francophone, anglophone, and Aboriginal populations, as well as the Métis and Inuit communities. There are lakes. rivers and mountains, where you can hunt and fish, rough it in the wilderness, hike and kayak, and, at the end of the day, camp out under the northern lights. The curious can visit hydroelectric dams and open-pit mines. When winter comes, the North Shore is THE place to snowshoe and ski, or to go snowmobiling and dog sledding.

The Translabrador Highway is now fully paved! Starting in Baie-Comeau on Route 289, the drive is <u>1,700</u> <u>km</u> long and will take you at least <u>26 hours</u>. It crosses Labrador from west to east on Routes 500 and 510 then continues down to the Lower North Shore. Once there, a scenic detour beckons: a 150-km trip along the Chicoutai* Scenic Route, from Blanc-Sablon to Vieux-Fort and back, to view the majestic waterways of the Gulf of St.Lawrence.

(*Chicoutais, or cloudberries, are small flavourful, amber-coloured berries native to Quebec's North Shore)



REGIONAL CELL PHONE COVERAGE

In provincial news, Québec grants \$21 million to improve cell phone coverage in the Côte-Nord, Chaudière-Appalaches, Gaspésie and Bas-Saint-Laurent regions.

To improve regional cell phone coverage, the Québec government is investing \$21 million to support major projects for network coverage. The Minister of Finance and Minister responsible for Relations with English-speaking Quebecers, Mr. Eric Girard, made the announcement, specifying that TELUS Communications and Sogetel Mobilité will share this sum to carry out the work in several regions of Quebec. TELUS Communications has been awarded funding for a number of projects aimed at servicing key road sections in the Côte-Nord region,

More specifically, the Route 138, with the construction of six towers in the Minganie and Sept-Rivières MRCs; and Route 389, thanks to the construction of three towers north of the city of Baie-Comeau, up to Manic-2 in the Manicouagan MRC.

14 BILINGUAL GUIDES BEGIN WORK BECAUSE OF BAIE-COMEAU'S COLLABORATIVE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT VENTURE

Baie-Comeau's Collaborative Public, Private, and Civil Society Economic Development Venture leveraged the growing number of cruise ship visits and the availability of bilingual talent in the region to, (a) create 14 new bilingual guide jobs in the local economy and (b) collaborate with workforce development service providers to also upskill existing talent. Nineteen cruise ships are confirmed to dock in Baie-Comeau in 2023, with an expected 12,000 visitors, and the seventeen Bilingual Guides debuted their services on May 24, 2023.

Creating amazing tourist experiences and telling stories about people, places, and activities in Baie-Comeau provides cruise ship passengers with the encounters, adventures, dreams, and memories they look for. With this in mind, the Collaborative Venture reached out to multiple community partners to help equip the new guides with the skills they need to engage, inform, interest, and entertain their cruise ship visitors. Venture Partners include:

The North Shore Community Association (NCSA) - a community organization serving, the Englishspeaking community of Quebec's North Shore.

Les Croisières Baie-Comeau - responsible for welcoming cruise ships and their passengers and providing for the ships' logistical needs.

Archeo Mamu - an organization that works with aboriginals and non-aboriginals alike to protect, understand, and disseminate the North Shore's First Nations and Euro-Canadians archaeological heritage through an innovative, respectful, and inclusive approach.

Espace K Théâtre - a local theatre company specializing in communication, creativity, and storytelling.

On May 9 and 10, 2023, Archeo Mamu conducted a comprehensive training curriculum for the guides, which included sessions on the history and archeology of the region. Espace K Théâtre complemented this training with a skills development session related to creative storytelling and audience engagement. As a result of this training, Walter Bisson, an 86-year-old retired explosives expert turned tour guide stated, "I can now speak about arrow heads found in archaeological digs in a more informed and dynamic way. The training helped us to think about and act differently with our clients". Mr. Bisson added, "It was also the first time we received presentations from representatives of 5 local tourist attractions. We now have more compelling local information to share with our visitors."

Meaningful tourist experiences will prompt cruise ship passengers to promote Baie-Comeau as a vacation destination to their friends, neighbors, and colleagues. In creating such experiences, Baie-Comeau will strengthen the longevity and sustainability of its local cruise ship tourist market.

School Readiness Kits

In Quebec, the only requirement for a child to go to school is to be the appropriate age on the 30th of September: 4 for pre-kindergarten, 5 for kindergarten, and 6 for grade 1.

You want to help your child have the best experience at school, and school entry can be stressful for the whole family. The NSCA has created a School Readiness kit to help you navigate this stressful life event. These free-of-charge, kits contain books, tips on routines, and toys and activities to help guide parents and transition their children into school.

As a parent, your job is to be sure your child is ready for day-to-day learning. Be sure they have enough sleep, eat breakfast and bring a snack to school. Belly full and well-rested is the best way to start learning.

Some activities that help develop:

- Gross motor skills: running, walking, climbing, crawling, tumbling.
- Fine motor skills: drawing, painting, using scissors and glue sticks, making puzzles.
- Spatial awareness: dancing, walking the neighbourhood, scavenger hunts.
- Social skills: playing with others, meeting new people.
- Language skills: reading, telling stories, telling about their days, singing.

Launch of Heritage Capsules


