



Suicide Prevention Workshop September 2023

As part of Suicide Prevention Month in September, the NSCA, along with Laurie Tremblay from Aire Ouverte, held an activity at **BCHS** all about Suicide prevention. They talked about how to deal with suicide, recognizing that someone may be at risk and that it is okay to talk about suicide. Eleven students took part in this activity and said they were happy to have this type of activity. At **QEHS**, we were joined by Audrey Gagnon from Aire Ouverte where she had a kiosk, and students enjoyed a true or false game on facts about suicide prevention and awareness.

Additionally, in partnership with LEARN, the NSCA organized a second mental health activity in September, Wellness Innovation Lab, with 11 Secondary students at BCHS.
