APRIL IS AUTISM AWARENESS MONTH

The month of April is dedicated to learning about autism spectrum disorders (ASD) and focuses on embracing and uplifting positive aspects of autistic identity, empowering individuals to fully appreciate and take pride in their experiences.

April 2 was designated by the United Nations in 2007 as the one day a year to recognize autism and this date continues to current date.

Understanding autism as a developmental disability, which affects both genders, aids us in understanding how an autistic individual functions and views the world around them, which in turn guides us in developing training programs. Autism affects the brain with signs/symptoms manifesting themselves around the age of 3 years old.

These early signs are often noticed in:

- · Difficulty interacting socially;
- Problems with verbal and non-verbal communication;
- · Restrictive and/or repetitive behaviours; and,
- · Limited set of interests or activities.

There has been a noticeable rise of autism in many countries placing challenges on education, health care, and training sectors.

Currently, there are 20 Biblio bags available at the Alice Lane Library in Baie Comeau where they are located by the already familiar Travelling Literacy Bags. Eleven bags are available to the NSCA office in Sept.-îles. Each of these bags contains 5 different themed books and covers topics such as culture, seasons and holidays. The target group for the bags are 0-9 years in Baie Comeau and 0-12 years in Sept-îles. This initiative was developed to help instill a life-long love of reading and learning in our children. 
WERE YOU AWARE...

The Sept-îles Hospital has a wonderful navigation system by way of pictograms and geolocators?

In 2023, the CISSS de la Côte Nord participated in a pilot project which has now become a reality where pictograms and geo-locators assist the English-speaking population navigate the corridors of the hospital. Community members of the Acceess Committee assisted in the pilot program, one of which was the NSCA.

Images, representing the service are affixed throughout the hospital for ease of getting to the proper department. Two touch screens (geolocators) can be found at the main entrance and the emergency department entrance to help users find their way in around the hospital.

BILL 96 - QUEBEC'S CHARTER OF THE FRENCH LANGUAGE AND HOW IT CAN IMPACT YOU - EDUCALOI

Bill 96 has brought significant changes to Quebec's language laws. It makes it challenging to know when you can and can't use English.

Bill 96 is a provincial law, passed by Quebec's National Assembly. The Act, officially known as, "An Act Respecting French, the official and common language of Quebec", establishes French as the official language of Quebec in business, law, and the workplace and was passed in June 2022.

The goal is to protect and strengthen French as the official language within the province. There are specific rules that affect the language of service, written communication, advertisement and trademarks and if there is non-compliance, there are fines to pay.

For example, in the education field, the Bill places caps on the number of students permitted in English-language institutions providing college instruction, and states that the total number of English-language students cannot exceed 17.5% of the French-language student population.Workplace language, requiring French in certain documents, communications, and contracts and limiting the use of other languages in certain situations. In the government arena, the Bill emphasizes the use of French in government services and public administration, with a duty to use French in an exemplary and exclusive manner, subject to certain exceptions.

Anglophones retain certain language rights, including the right to access government services in English, receive health and social services in English, and have their children educated in English if they met specific criteria.
